The Bridge church family were beyond happy to witness Sean and Wallace being baptized on Palm Sunday. These 2 men made a public declaration of their faith and committed to continue following Jesus. Our staff walked with them and watched the Holy Spirit work in them from the inside out.

As we prayed for these 2 men and their new lives in Christ, we claimed the truth of this verse: *Therefore* we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, in order that just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so also we may live a new way of life" (Romans 6:4, NIV).





At the beginning of March, Saskatoon was covered in a big pile of snow. By the grace of God, we were able to open our doors when many services in the city were closed due to the unfortunate weather. As a staff team, we were concerned about the well-being of our visitors, especially those who are homeless.

During that week, we prayed for specific people that the Lord had put in our hearts. We also prayed for the emergency shelters in the city since they would have more occupants than usual. We even heard that one of our visitors was reported as a missing person, so we lifted her up in our prayers.

The next day, we saw the answer to these prayers!

The people we were praying for came through our door and we were so glad to be able to catch up with them. That one visitor that went missing was found that morning, safe and sound. One of our visitors who stayed in one of the emergency shelters, shared with a staff how the shelter felt different that night.

Indeed, there were more people in the room; but somehow, it was quiet and peaceful.

As we saw more answered prayers throughout the week, we continued to pray for our community, our city, and our partners. Answered prayers like these grew our faith to continue to ask for the "immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine" (Ephesians 3:20, NIV).





Sometimes building trust only comes through providing a practical need. When a staff member noticed a visitor needed mitts, she brought a bag of mitts out for her to choose from. She received the gift and the gesture seemed to disarm her weariness. It was the first time that staff had a personal interaction with her. By noticing her needs without being asked, the staff gained her trust to start a relationship.

Trust goes a long way in any relationship. Another staff had been walking with a visitor in her journey of sobriety and raising a family as a single mother. One day, the visitor reached out to this member in desperation as she said, "You're the only one that I could think of right now! The staff came to her aid. The visitor was able to calm down and later resolve her situation. We hold this trust with care and honor as we continue to be the ambassadors of God's kingdom.
